S1. Ans.(a)

Sol. According to the rule, '**No sooner**' is followed by '**than**'. Also, just after '**no sooner**' we use helping verb i.e. it is a case where "inversion" entertains the sentence. So, replace "when" with "than" to make the sentence grammatically correct.

Q2. Select the most appropriate option to substitute the bold segment in the given sentence. If there is no need to substitute it, select No improvement.

If you set your mind to a goal, **you eventually achieve it.**

- (a) you would eventually achieve it
- (b) you would eventually have achieved it

S2. Ans.(c)

Sol. The given sentence is an example of 1st conditional sentences. It is used to express a situation in which the outcome is likely (but not guaranteed) to happen in the future. The syntax it follows is:

If + Present Indefinite (V1), Future Indefinite (will/shall + V1)

Hence, "**you will eventually achieve it**" is the right usage here.

Scrupulous: (of a person or process) careful, thorough, and extremely attentive to details.

Sol. Gigantic: of very great size or extent; huge or enormous.

Colossal: extremely large or great.

Embolden: give (someone) the courage or confidence to do something.

Hence Gigantic and Colossal are synonyms to each other.

Sol. Jovial: cheerful and friendly.

Jolly: happy and cheerful.

Hence Jovial and Jolly are synonyms to each other.

Hence **Obscure** and **Distinct** are antonyms to each other.


