Sol. Java Trench, also called Sunda Double Trench, deep submarine depression in the eastern Indian Ocean that extends some 2,000 miles (3,200 km) in a northwest-southeast arc along the southwestern and southern Indonesian archipelago.

Sol. Trade Winds also known as easterlies due to the reason that the trade winds usually , blow from the east . These winds blow from sub tropical high pressure areas towards the equatorial low - pressure belt.

Sol. The daily range of temperature decreases on proceeding equator to poles.

Sol. It is one of the rivers in India that flows in a rift valley, flowing west between the Satpura and Vindhya ranges. Being the rift valley river, Narmada river does not form delta. Rift valley river forms estuaries. The other rivers which flow through rift valley include Damodar River in Chota Nagpur Plateau and Tapi.

Sol. Musi is the tributary of Krishna, Panganga, Wanganga, Wardha, Indiravati, Pravada etc. are the tributaries of Godavari.

Sol. Manipur Indian states does not have a common international border with Bangladesh. India enjoys close relations with Bangladesh and shares a 4,096-km-long border which touches Assam, Tripura, Mizoram, Meghalaya and West Bengal.
