#### **Global Competitiveness Index 2023**

The **2023 Global Competitiveness Index**, published by the International Institute for Management Development (IMD), has named Denmark, Ireland, and Switzerland as the top three most competitive economies among 64 nations surveyed. The report highlights the unique approaches taken by these countries to achieve competitiveness and emphasizes the importance of long-term value creation. # Global Competitiveness Index 2023: India's Position: Progress Amidst Challenges

India, despite experiencing a slight drop of three ranks, finishes in 40th place in the 2023 Global Competitiveness Index, indicating an improvement compared to its consistent 43rd position between 2019 and 2021. The IMD report highlights several areas of advancement and challenges faced by India in its pursuit of competitiveness.

#### **Areas of Improvement:**

- Government Efficiency: India demonstrated improvement in government efficiency, reflecting positive developments in governance and public administration.
- 2. Exchange Rate Stability: The stability of India's exchange rate played a significant role in boosting its competitiveness score, contributing to a favorable business environment.
- 3. Compensation Levels and Pollution Control: India's competitive score benefited from its compensation levels and efforts to improve pollution control, emphasizing a focus on sustainable practices.

# Global Competitiveness Index 2023: Noteworthy Advancements:

- 1. Ireland's Remarkable Leap: Ireland's ascent from 11th to second place demonstrates its commitment to competitiveness. The country's access to markets and trading partners has played a pivotal role in its remarkable progress.
- 2. Singapore's Consistency: Despite falling one spot to fourth place, Singapore remains a highly competitive economy. The country's ability to leverage its market access and maintain consistency in competitiveness is commendable.
- 3. India's Progress: India, ranking 40th, experienced an improvement from its previous position of 43rd. Notable strengths for India include exchange rate stability, compensation levels, and advancements in pollution control. However, there are challenges to address, such as maintaining high GDP growth, controlling inflation and fiscal deficit, and accelerating digital transformation.

## **Challenges and Regional Insights:**

- 1. **Europe's Prominence**: European economies dominated the top 10 rankings in 2023, with five countries featured. Denmark, Switzerland, Ireland, Netherlands, and Sweden showcased their competitive prowess, although Sweden slipped four places from the previous year.
- 2. **South American Lag**: Six South American countries occupied the bottom 10 positions in the index, with Venezuela ranking last at 64th place. Argentina, Mongolia, South Africa, Brazil, Botswana, and Colombia also faced competitiveness challenges.



Arab World Advancements: Saudi Arabia climbed seven places to reach the 17th rank globally and ranked third in the Arab world. Qatar improved by six places, securing the 12th position worldwide and second in the Arab world. Bahrain advanced five places to claim the 25th spot globally and fourth in the Arab world. The United Arab Emirates maintained its leadership in the Arab world, securing the tenth position globally. Jordan saw a two-place advancement, ending at 54th place globally but last in the Arab world at the sixth position.

#### **Global Startup Ecosystem Report 2023**

The recently released Global Startup Ecosystem Report 2023 (GSER 2023) by Startup Genome provides a comprehensive analysis of startup ecosystems worldwide. With data from millions of startups across various ecosystems, the report offers valuable insights into the global startup landscape. Bengaluru, known as India's Silicon Valley, has secured the 20th position on the list, climbing two spots from the previous year.

#### Global Startup Ecosystem Report 2023: Top Ecosystems

The report highlights that the top three ecosystems—Silicon Valley, New York City, and London—have maintained their positions from 2020, securing the top spots. However, Boston and Beijing have slipped out of the top five, making room for Los Angeles to rise to #4 and Tel Aviv to #5.

#### Rise of Singapore and Miami:

Singapore has made an impressive entry into the top 10, climbing ten places to secure the 8th position. This significant improvement marks Singapore's growing prominence in the global startup ecosystem. Additionally, Miami has made notable progress, advancing ten positions to reach #23, firmly establishing itself among the top 30 ecosystems.

## **Chinese Ecosystems:**

The rankings show a decline for major Chinese ecosystems. Shenzhen dropped 12 places, Beijing slipped two spots, and Shanghai fell one position, currently standing at #35, #7, and #9, respectively.

#### **Growth of Indian Ecosystems:**

Indian ecosystems continue to rise, with Mumbai leading the way by climbing five places to reach a tie at #31. Bengaluru-Karnataka and Delhi both moved up two places, securing the 20th and 24th positions, respectively. The report attributes this progress to India's growing digital public infrastructure, which has played a significant role in driving the country's startup growth.

#### **Emerging Ecosystems:**

Pune, an emerging ecosystem in India, has made substantial progress, moving into the 31-40 range from 51-60 in the previous year's rankings. This upward trajectory indicates Pune's potential as a thriving startup hub. Other Indian cities have also witnessed notable advancements, reflecting the country's overall growth in the tech sector.

#### **Impressive Gains:**

Melbourne, Australia, has seen remarkable progress, climbing six places to secure the 33rd position. The Australian ecosystem's Ecosystem Value has grown by 43% since the GSER 2022. Zurich, Switzerland, has also made significant strides, rising ten places to reach #36, marking the most substantial year-on-year improvement in Europe.

The QS World University Rankings continue to showcase the dominance of American universities, which secure half of the spots in the top 20.

#### **QS World University Rankings 2024: Key Highlights**

- Institutions in both Europe and America dominate the top 10 rankings, with many receiving perfect scores of 100 in indicators such as 'Academic reputation', 'Employer reputation', and 'Faculty/Student ratio'.
- The National University of Singapore (NUS) is the only institution from Asia to secure a place in the top 10.

- The University of California, Berkeley (UCB) is the sole institution to achieve a perfect score of 100 in the new 'Sustainability' indicator. Other universities with high sustainability scores include the University of Pennsylvania (ranked 12th), University of Toronto (ranked 21st), and University of British Columbia (ranked 34th), all with scores of 99.9.
- The rankings feature 85 new entrants, with more than half coming from Asia. Bangladesh (11 new institutions), Indonesia (10), India and Malaysia (five each), and Kazakhstan (four) have the highest representation among the new entrants.
- Two of the new entrants, the National University of Singapore and the University of California, Berkeley, have secured a place in the top 10 rankings.
- Other new locations included in this year's rankings are Iceland and Luxembourg, with one institution each, as well as Nigeria (two) and Ethiopia (one).
- Noteworthy new entrants achieving excellent results include Hamad bin Khalifa University from Qatar and the University of Luxembourg, securing their places in the top 400.

# RBI's Financial Stability Report Highlights Strong Performance of Indian Banking Sector

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) recently released its 27th Financial Stability Report (FSR), presenting an assessment of the Indian financial system's resilience and risks. Despite global uncertainties and challenges, the Indian economy continues to display robust growth supported by strong macroeconomic fundamentals. The banking sector, in particular, has performed well, outshining the turmoil experienced by advanced economies.

## Here are the key highlights from the report:

- 1. **Robust Deposit Growth**: Exceeding 10% Threshold Aggregate deposit growth, which had experienced a slight moderation in the previous two years, regained momentum and crossed the 10% mark, reaching 11.8% as of June 2, 2023. The primary driver of this growth was private-sector banks, as term deposits attracted healthy accretions in the rising interest rate cycle. Consequently, current account and savings account (CASA) deposits experienced a relative decline.
- 2. **Impressive Credit Growth**: Surpassing 15% Benchmark The banking sector witnessed remarkable credit growth, driven equally by public sector banks and private banks. Credit growth reached an impressive 15.4%, with significant contributions from the personal loan segment. Personal loans, encompassing housing, credit card receivables, vehicle/auto loans, and education loans, experienced broad-based growth of 22.2% year-on-year.





- 3. **Enhanced Asset Quality**: GNPA Reaches Decadal Low Banks have successfully improved their asset quality by reducing the proportion of non-performing assets. Scheduled commercial banks (SCBs) continued to enhance their asset quality, with the gross non-performing assets (GNPA) ratio falling to a 10-year low of 3.9% in March 2023. Additionally, the net non-performing assets (NNPA) ratio improved to 1.0%, a level last seen in June 2011.
- 4. **Decline in Large Borrowers**: Retail Loans Gain Traction Over the past three years, the share of large borrowers in the gross advances of SCBs has consistently decreased. It dropped from 51.1% in March 2020 to 46.4% in March 2023, primarily due to the faster growth of retail loans compared to corporate borrowings. Consequently, the share of large borrowers in the GNPA of SCBs also substantially declined.
- 5. **Profit Margin Boost**: Higher Net Interest Margin and Strong PAT Growth During the period of 2022-23, banks experienced a 30 basis points improvement in net interest margin (NIM), as the transmission of monetary policy tightening to deposit rates lagged behind the pass-through to lending rates. This resulted in a healthy 38.4% year-on-year growth in bank's profit after tax (PAT), driven by a significant increase in net interest income (NII) and reduced provisions.

# RBI Financial Stability Report, June 2023: Indian Economy and Financial System Remain Resilient

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has released the 27th issue of the Financial Stability Report (FSR), providing an assessment of risks to financial stability and the resilience of the Indian financial system. Despite global uncertainties, the Indian economy and domestic financial system exhibit strength, supported by robust macroeconomic fundamentals.

## **Global Economic Uncertainty:**

Heightened uncertainty persists in the global economy due to fragility in certain banking systems, geopolitical tensions, and moderating but elevated inflation.

#### **Resilience of Indian Economy:**

Amidst global headwinds, the Indian economy demonstrates resilience, benefiting from continued growth momentum, moderating inflation, a narrowing current account deficit, rising foreign exchange reserves, ongoing fiscal consolidation, and a robust financial system.

# **Encouraging Signs for Indian Economy:**


The healthy balance sheets of banks and corporates are fostering a new credit and investment cycle, brightening the prospects of sustained growth for the Indian economy.

### **Strong Capital Adequacy:**

Scheduled commercial banks (SCBs) witnessed historical highs in capital to risk-weighted assets ratio (CRAR) and common equity tier 1 (CET1) ratio. As of March 2023, the CRAR stood at 17.1%, while the CET1 ratio reached 13.9%.


